VACANCY: TREASURER

Observant readers of the CHS newsletters may have noticed that the position of Honorary Treasurer has been vacant since May 2023. The duties have been handled by me, a fast-fading ghost who will disappear into thin air in the near future. It is therefore necessary for a member to step up and take over these duties; otherwise the Society will have no option but to appoint an entity such as a bookkeeper/accountant, which is not a terribly efficient way of using the Society's hard-earned funds.

It strikes me that many members are unnecessarily frightened of the perceived need to be a financial genius in order to handle the CHS's financial transactions. Believe it or not, it's not actually rocket science. The work requires no additional expertise that members - both male and female - don't already have, and use, with their own personal banking.

CHS's transactions consist of EFT subscription payments by members, which require no action by the Treasurer other than making sure that every member has paid (I've always done this in collaboration with Glenda), and the EFT payments of, on average, two to three invoices a month. Once a year there will be the need to bank cash after a Plant Sale.

Granted, making up the accounts at the end of the financial year is not everyone's cup of tea, but if the Treasurer cannot manage it, CHS won't be the first, nor the last, Society that will hand a friendly bookkeeper/auditor a shoebox full of slips etc together with a note saying, "Please sort out for the AGM".

I'm more than happy to hold the new Treasurer's hand until he/she is happy with doing it on their own. As the Honorary Auditor for 2023, I will help the Treasurer to prepare the "shoebox" for the AGM report.

These photographs show the lovely quirky statuary, attractive tree barks and the new Moss Garden, a work in progress.


